

Bernal requested Brett Lyman be raised to 26-1. This was approved by the Commission.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMLISSIONERS MEETING HELD NOVEMBER 13, 1978

Minutes were read and approved on a motion by Commissioner Guymon and seconded by Commissioner Black.

SCHOOL BOARD MEETING

Commissioner meeting was adjourned for 1 hour so that the Commissioners could meet with the school board.

COMMISSIONER BLACK REPORTS

Commissioner Black reported that he will meet with Paul Gilgan this week and that he has an Energy Council meeting on Tuesday. He will be in Los Vegas for a Western Region of the Association of Counties convention.

WEED BOARD MEETING

Commissioner Guymon reported that he had attended a weed board meeting last Thursday. He stated that they had worked out a budget for next year which is the same as this year. Commissioner Guymon also reported that Jim Heaton had asked for an additional man. The Commissioners discussed having 2 weed districts with Jim Heaton as a coordinator and 2 men to cover the North and 2 men to cover the South area. These could possibly from the CETA program.

LIBRARY BOARD MEETING

Commissioner Guymon also attended the Library Board Meeting. He stated that the library board is planning to buy new drapes for both libraries. Because the drapes will cost about \$3,000.00 this must be put up for bids. Both Libraries will be needing new roofs. The commissioners discussed budgeting for this in next years budget. It will cost about 15,000 dollars per library to put on a new roof. The commissioners discussed putting a new tile roofing on the roof.

BLANDING SWIMMING POOL

Commissioner Guymon reported that Alvin Black had finished installing the new heater in the Blanding Swimming Pool. Commissioner Guymon and LaRay Alexander will work to gether to get the equipment checked and the voucher okayed for payment.

HEALTH MEETINGS IN GREEN RIVER

Commissioner Black and Commissioner Boyle attended the Health Meeting in Green River. All four counties voted to accept the same formula which is the Michigan formula. The Michigan formula consists of 50% assessed valuation and 50% population. It was approved to raise public health's budget 15% and mental health's budget 15%. The Commissioners want to integrate the mental health into the Social Services.

EMT PROBLEMS

The Commissioners discussed some problems that the EMT's are having. They discussed having a budget separate from but under the hospital budget or else having an EMT budget that is separate from the hospital. The Commissioners want the EMT's to keep up with their certification.

BUILDING INSPECTOR

Bob Low and Phil Acton are the building inspectors for the county. Commissioner Boyle talked to Bob Low about the salary and he feels that it is adequate. The building inspector can issue building permits but the building inspector must make sure that the clerk has a copy of the building permit. It was suggested that the County Sheriff's keep an eye on the building that is going on in the county and report this to the building inspector so that they county can be paroled on the building permits.

MONTEZUMA CREEK BEER ISSUE

Commissioner Boyle talked to Bennion about the beer issue in Montezuma Creek. The Commissioners are awaiting word from the County Attorney on the best way to handle this issue.

TRANSIENT ROOM TAX

The Commissioners discussed the Transient Room Tax. The Commissioners are willing to pass the Transient Room Tax but only if Grand and San Juan County become a regional Council and then only if this is their only funding.

TV

The Bluff Solar System is now working but Channel 10 is out on the Mountain. Jim Allred is to get a snow cat from Moab and get up to the peak and find out what is wrong. He will do this Tuesday. The Commissioners also stated that he should have a regular schedule to examine each area. The county's TV contract should be Jim's first priority, and the commissioners told Jim this.

SIGNS

Raymond Skidmore (Freddie) met with the Commissioners to discuss the lack of signs on the Ucolo road. There are no regulatory signs at all. Speed limit signs are needed and a sign is needed notifying motorists of the ninety degree turn where the Ucolo road joins the West Summit road. Lynn came up to the meeting and this will be corrected.

Commissioner Guymon stated that there are no Speed Limit Signs on the Reservoir Road and they were supposed to have been installed several months ago.

COUNTY CANVASS

The Commissioners canvassed the election held last week at 12:00 noon as required by law.

BLUFF MULTIPURPOSE BUILDING

Al Haskins and the Commissioners discussed the Bluff Multipurpose Building. This must be put up for bid. Commissioner Black suggested having a contractor draw up the plans for the building.

FIRST AID KITS IN COUNTY BUSES

Commissioner Guymon reported that he had received a complaint from Ken Hickman concerning the lack of first aid kits and fire extinguishers in the county buses. Al Haskins reported that he had taken both first aid kits and fire extinguishers and given them to Ken to be put in the buses. Mr. Haskins is to check with Ken about this complaint.

MONTEZUMA CREEK AMBULANCE

Commissioner Boyle received a check in the amount of \$9,759.00 for the reimbursement of Contract No. 79-8076, which provides for assistance in the purchase of the ambulance for Montezuma Creek. Commissioner Boyle turned the check into the Treasure on November 9, 1978.

ABATEMENTS APPROVED

The Commissioners approved the abatements for J. P. Gonzales and Alta Douglas.

FENCING AGREEMENT

The Commissioners approved a fencing agreement with Utah Department of Transportation, LaSal Livestock Company and San Juan County on a motion by Commissioner Black and seconded by Commissioner Guymon and passed unanimously. This will be along US. 163 from LaSal Junction to Mormon Tank Wash.

WATER WAGON

Lynn Adams discussed with the Commissioners the Water Wagon that he was instructed to get information on. He stated that he had gotten them to come down from \$84,000.00 to \$78,000.00. The Commissioners asked Lynn to check on the warranty. They don't want a 3 month warranty. They want a warranty based on an hourly schedule otherwise the Water Wagon could sit in the shop for 3 months without being used and then the warranty would have expired.



MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING HELD NOVEMBER 20, 1978

TIME: 10:30 A.M.

Minutes were read and corrected, corrections being the amount of the Mental Health Budget was 10% and not 15% as in the minutes. Also last week the meeting was "recessed" and not adjourned to meet with the school board. Upon these corrections, a motion for their approval was made by Commissioner Black and seconded by Commissioner Guymon.

NAVAJO MOUNTAIN SENIOR CITIZENS CENTER

Al Haskins reported on the Navajo Mountain Senior Citizens Center. He said they were in need of furniture and that they could use some tables and chairs. The motion to authorize the purchase of furnishings was given by Commissioner Guymon and seconded by Commissioner Black. The Commissioners recommended that Al keep a constant inventory as to where everything was, and Mr. Haskins reported that he had purchased an etching tool to mark and label the furniture. He also gave the Commissioners a report on the meals and a financial report of the center. The Commissioners also approved the purchase of electrical supplies to complete the wiring of the center. The motion was made by Commissioner Guymon and seconded by Commissioner Black.

CIVIL DEFENSE

The Commissioners authorized Al Haskins to purchase surplus properties. This motion was given by Commissioner Guymon and seconded by Commissioner Black.

OIL COMPANY TAXES

Commissioner Black reported on his meeting with Attorney General Bob Hansen, Deputy Attorney Generals Blain Davis and Frank Nelson. They are going to look into the matter of the oil companies paying their taxes under protest. If they should do so, the county will not be able to use their money for six months. If within six months no legal action has been taken the money can be used; however if the action is still under litigation the money cannot be used until the problem is solved. Arizona and New Mexico have suits pending against the oil companies. Ed Clyde is the representative for the oil companies. Commissioner Black also gave the statement that if the oil companies pay under protest, it will put the county and school district in a serious financial situation, and drastic changes in the county budget next year.

LIBRARY

Commissioner Guymon reported that he had received a call from Corrine Roring concerning the Monticello Library. Due to the recent storms the basement in the Library, the museum part is half flooded. Dave asked the Commission if the County could install a concrete catch basin and perforated pipe for drainage. He said that Jim Douglas will help with the project. The matter was open for suggestions and comments. The project will get underway soon before the ground freezes.

BLANDING SWIMMING POOL

Commissioner Guymon also reported on his meeting with Alan Black concerning the Blanding Swimming Pool. The work on the boiler for the pool is now complete, and operating in good shape. Al Haskins brought the contract for the work to the meeting along with a voucher which the commissioners signed paying Mr. Black in full for his services.

WEED BUDGET

The Commissioners discussed the need for two crews, and a small discussion of the budget followed.

PUBLIC HEALTH

Marion ^{Hazleton} of the Public Health office gave an assesment of the Health Program to the Commissioners. It included the total budget for the year. He explained the expenditures and stated that we now have a total General Public Health Program. The Michigan Formula was agreed acceptable by the Commissioners.

T.V.

Commissioner Boyle stated that he had discussed the problems of the T.V. with Jim Alred, and had gotten the name of Town T.V. Manager Tom Worster. The Commissioners discussed the possibility of buying the sattalite signal that Town T.V. now has bringing in a special channel with absolute movie presentations.

ROAD SIGNS

The signs on the Reservoir Road are up and it was reported that the Ucolo Road signs will be put up this week.
