The regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners was held this day in the Clerk's office. Noel W. Sitton, J. W. Crowley and Clerk present.

Mr. Jackson and Mr. Fifield, representing the "Constitutional Life Insurance Company" met with the commissioners in regard to their plan of Insurance. The Commissioners stated that in as much as the plan deals entirely with individuals they felt that it did not come within the jurisdiction of the Board.

Mr. Hawkins of the Hawkins Drilling Company and Attorney Guy Dwyer met with the Board in regard to the assessed valuation of personal property, particularly the drilling rig and equipment belonging to the Hawkins Drilling Company. The Commissioners stated that these valuations were made by the State Tax Commission and that the Board of County Commissioners could do nothing in regard to changing the assessment, but that they would let the assessment ride until an investigation could be made.

Clement Johnson and Philip Hurst, representing the County Hospital Board consulted with the Board in regard to the Hospital finances. It was moved by Sitton, seconded by Crowley and carried to appropriate \$1500 of the Liquor Control money for the maintenance of the Hospital.

A. J. Redd, Chairman of the County Civil Defense, reported on the Civil Defense meeting held in Salt Lake January 19. He stated that Mr. Higgins would be in Monticello some time near the middle of March to meet with the local board. and that it was his opinion that it would be well for San Juan County to wait until Mr. Higgins was here to do any thing further in setting up a complete organization.

Mr. Redd also, talked to the Commissioners in regard to setting a tax levy for rain making. The Commissioners promised to put the matter before the taxpayers before time for setting the annual levy for 1952.

It was moved by Crowley and seconded by Mr. Sitton to purchase a Remington-Rand Dexograph Camera @ \$1290.00, a Dryer @ \$407.00 and processing equipment @ \$430.00, making a total of \$2222.00. Carried.
