June 1, 1948

The Board of County Commissioners met this day in regular session, with Chairman N. W. Sitton, L. J. Bartell and Clerk in attendance.

Mr. Kealy of the State Aeronautics Commission met with the Board and asked that the Board, in behalf of San Juan County, make an Project Application for Federal Aid in the development of the Moab Air Port which is located in San Juan County.

The attached resolutions were introduced by L. J. Bartell, and after due consideration they were unanimously adopted.

A delegation of Summit Point people presented a petition asking for a gravel project on the West Summit road. In view of the fact that there is insufficient funds on hand for this project it was decided that it be recommended as a project to be taken up by the incoming commissioners following the November election.

Minutes of the meeting of April 4, 1947 and of May 4 were read and approved.

It was moved by Sitton and seconded by Bartell that the contracts between the County and the Soil Conservation and the F. H. A. for rent be extended for another year. Carried.

It was moved by Bartell and seconded by Sitton to write the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation that the county would pay the expense of hospitalization of W. R. Quigley for an operation on his leg.

It was voted that the lumber at the Fair Grounds be sold to Ernest Hatrel, whose bid of \$26.50 was the highest received.

A bid of \$50.00 by Jack Dumbreck for a Chevrolet Motor which was owned by the County was accepted.

A delegation of La Sal residents asked that three miles of road in the La Sal district be graveled. It was agreed to put in the necessary culverts, grade up the road and gravel the three miles, also to repair roads already graveled, providing gravel could be obtained from the State road supply.

The Board of County Commissioners met this day in regular session in the Clerk's office, all members and Clerk in attendance.

Minutes of Equalization Meeting of May 29 read and approved, Minutes of regular meeting of June 1, and minutes of Equalization meeting of June 19 read and approved.

Received from Jack Dumbreck \$48.00 for Chev. Motor. Two dollars having been deducted from the original price because pan was missing.

DEPUTY SHERIFF

Sheriff Norton stated that as Reed Larson had left La Sal it would be necessary to appoint another deputy sheriff for that precinct. It was moved by Rogers and seconded by Bartell that W.M. Shea be appointed to fill the position. Vote unanimous.

MONTICELLO TOWN ADDITION

It was moved by Rogers and seconded by Bartell to approve the application of the Monticello Town Board for additions to the Monticello Townsite as represented by a resolution and plats submitted by the Town Board. Vote unanimous. The tract is known as the Y. C. A. Upper Townsite Subdivision. The other as North Almer Cramer Highway.

ALMER CRAMER

At the request of the Commissioners, Almer Cramer appeared to answer to a complaint that he had allowed dancing in his place of business in direct opposition to the stipulation made by the commissioners at the time of his making petition for license to sell beer, and also to a complaint that he had sold beer to minors. Mr. Cramer denied that he had done either of these things. The hearing was continued until the regular meeting of Aug. 3, at which time Mr. Cramer is to appear.

APPROPRIATIONS FOR HOSPITAL

George Almer representing the Hospital board asked that the Commissioners appropriate \$2500.00 from the Liquor Control money allocated to San Juan to the San Juan County Hospital. It was unanimously agreed to set aside \$2500.00 from said fund for next year.

SUMMIT POINT ROAD

Reno T. Hansen, representing the Summit Point district turned in \$150.00 to the County which had been donated by the citizens of that district to help pay for a large culvert which was installed on the West Summit road. This was in accordance with an agreement made at the May 4, meeting.

LAND SALE

It was unanimously voted to sell to Jared I. Allen, the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 21, Township 29 South, Range 23 East, at \$1.00 per acre.

SALE OF TAX PROPERTY

It was voted unanimously to sell the County's interest in some mining machinery that is on the Colorado River, and which has been duly advertised for sale for delinquent taxes, to R. M. Barrett, for the sum of \$100.00. A check for the same having been received.

POUND KEEPER APPOINTED

On the recommendation of Karl R. Lyman it was voted to appoint Virgil Eastin Pound keeper for the County.
