

Bernal reported he had hired Helen Dennison on C.E.T.A. Program at 23-1. This was approved by the Commissioners. Bernal also hired H. A. Gerling at 26-1 as a permanent employee. Approved.

Bernal reported the Brakes on #29 Truck had failed and the Truck ran into another Truck, causing extensive Damage to the Cab. The Commissioners suggested a new cab be purchased for this vehicle.

Ace recommended Juan Valdez be given a 90 Day probation raise and be made a permanent employee. This was approved by the Commissioners.

Ace requested a cab for the John Deere Mower and the Backhoe. It was approved to get one for the Backhoe.

Doug reported the new Pump was being installed in the Red Mesa Well today.

Doug reported he had met with Cassidy engineering firm on the Monticello airport. Their estimate was \$432,600.00. The county share would be \$19,000.00. This was approved by the Commissioners.

Commissioner Black was excused to attend the Meeting of the Southeastern Utah Association of Governments in Price.

Minutes were read and approved as read on a motion by Commissioner Guymon and seconded by Commissioner Boyle.

BEER LICENSE BALLOT ISSUE

The Commissioners discussed putting the issue of selling beer in the Montezuma Creek area with San Juan County Clerk and Auditor, Clytie Barber and County Attorney Bennion Redd. Mrs. Barber presented the wording on a sample ballot and asked for the commissions approval. The county attorney felt that the wording was clear and self explanatory. This was approved by the Commissioners.

The commissioners also discussed dividing the County Clerk and Auditor's office.

SPANISH VALLEY ANNEXATION

Commissioner Boyle stated that Dixie Barker had notified him that Moab and Grand county were starting the steps to annex Spanish Valley into Grand County. Commissioner Boyle stated that the Commissioners were against this annexation as were the people of San Juan County. He also stated that these people from Moab who were in favor of the annexation would have to do all the work.

COUNTY ROAD

Commissioner Black stated that Grant Bayles had talked to him about having the county road to the oil mixing area moved. It runs across his land and was put there against his will. The commissioners had promised him over a year ago that this would be changed. Commissioner Boyle instructed Commissioner Guymon to get with Bernal and get this taken care of as soon as possible.

BEER LICENSE-LASAL

Clytie Barber, Clerk and Auditor, presented a beer license for the Korner Kafe in LaSal. Sheriff Wright is to check this out and give his approval or disapproval at the next commissioners meeting.

4 CORNERS MENTAL HEALTH

Commissioner Boyle attended the 4 Corners Mental Health "on Sight Review meeting held in Price. He also attended a meeting on Unification and Integrated health systems. He stated that San Juan County was in favor of Unification and Rick Maynard was in charge of our county's Mental Health program.

FAIR GROUNDS

Al Haskins reported that Jim Stevens and Jim Heaton stated that the weeds at the fairgrounds need to be sprayed but that the weed budget didn't have enough money. Mr. Haskins stated there was money in the fair budget that could be used. This was approved by the Commissioners

EMPLOYMENT OF THE HANDICAPPED BOARD



MINUTES OF THE SAN JUAN COUNTY ROAD MEETING HELD OCTOBER 2, 1978

TIME: 9:00 A.M.

PRESENT: Commissioners E. Boyle and D. Guymon. Engineer D. Pehrson. Foremen A. Holden and L. Adams.

Minutes were read and approved.

Commissioner Boyle announced that road meeting will be held on the 1st and 3rd Mondays of each month. Ace reported he was doing maintenance work in the Hovenweep Area. Eddie reported Pete Black was claiming ownership to a culvert in a county road at Long Canyon. Lynn was instructed to see if he could find any notes on this. Ace requested a Water Trailer, Dave made motion that Lynn check on a tank that was available in Salt Lake City, and if it is still available, to go ahead and purchase it. Motion carried. Minutes read and approved on a motion by Commissioner Guymon and seconded by Commissioner Boyle.

Commissioner Black is excused on county business.

SUBDIVISION ROADS

The county Commissioners discussed the subdivision roads. The commissioners decided that they needed to have a definite policy on roads. When a road is brought up to county standards the County will take over the maintenance but that doesn't mean that they will pave these roads.

RED MESA PROJECT

The Commissioners discussed the Red Mesa and the water from the Red Mesa Well. The well is now in operation and will probably put out enough water but the project is going slower than was expected.

BEER LICENSES

On a recommendation by Sheriff Rigby Wright, the Commission approved and the chairman signed two beer licenses for LaSal. Both of these were renewals. One, for the LaSal store and one for Bob Shumway, the new owner of the Korner Kafe.

UNION CARBIDE HECLA LEASE

Commissioner Boyle presented a letter from Terence J. Keating stating that Union Carbide has decided to leave things as they are. They find the "State of Utah royalty schedule" unacceptable at this point and since they have a valid lease in that area, they feel they can operate under the terms of the lease.

ENERGY FUELS

Energy Fuels asked the Commissioners to write a letter to the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission to help them get a Source of Materials License with respect to ist proposed uranium mill to be located in southeastern Utah near Blanding. The Commissioners agreed to do this.

BUSES

Al Haskins presented the specifications for the purchase of new buses for San Juan County to the Commissioners. These were approved for publication for bids. The bid opening will be at 1:30 on October 23, 1978.

BLUFF

Clytie Barber, San Juan County Clerk and Auditor met with the Commissioners to discuss a phone call she had received from Utah Power and Light. They had received a letter from Bluff stating that Bluff was no longer a town and that they didn't have any more money to pay for their lights (street lights). It was suggested in the letter that they apply to the County for the money. Commissioner Boyle stated that they county was not obligated to pay for the bills of Bluff because at this time it is still a town. They asked Mrs. Barber to contact Utah Power and Light to this effect.

LETTER

Paul McPherson sent a copy of a letter addressed to Judge Boyd Bunnell, District Judge of the 7th Judicial Court. In this letter he stated that there is raw sewage running on the ground in Bluff. He requested that this problem be corrected. The commissioners discussed this problem with Marion Hazelton who stated that he would look into this problem.

AFFIRMATIVE ACTION PLAN

Greg Beckstrom presented a copy of an Affirmative Action Program to the commissioners along with several charts showing the % of people hired that are non-white or that are over 45 or under 22. These were approved by the Commissioners and the deputy clerk was instructed to type these up and return them to Mr. Beckstrom.

CETA GRANT

Bruce Shumway met with the Commissioners to discuss a new CETA grant which will provide part time work for Senior Citizens. Bruce stated that this would be a really good addition to the winterization, Low Income Housing program. The Commissioners stated that they are in favor of this.
