Commissioner Black presented a letter from Paul Gilgen in regard to time schedule on Bluff to Montezuma Creek. He reported there was some conflict on previous commitments. He said he would follow up on this.

Teek reported he was hauling pit run on Ismay Road, and would be ready to move as soon as he was through. Dave said he would check on easements on Cross Canyon Road, so teek could move there next.

Bernal reported he was waiting on approval from BLM to move Crucher to Mexican Hat.

Commissioner Black reported a public hearing would be held on Friday in regard to the clean air act in parts of San Juan County. He encouraged residents to attend and express their opinions.

Doug reported four survey points had been established within the city by private survey units.

Lynn reported he was advertizing for bids May 22 on culverts, tires, fuels, motor oil, grease and L. P. Gas.

Commissioner Guymon was excused on County Business.

Minutes read and approved on a Motion by Commissioner Black and seconded by Commissioner Boyle.

COUNTY LETTERHEAD

The Southeastern Utah Association of Counties wants some county letterhead. This was approved by the Commissioners and Clytie Barber was given authority to mail them some stationary.

XEROX MACHINE

Arvilla Warren, the county recorder, agreed with the policy adopted by the commissioners on the use of the Xerox Machine.

BLUFF PUBLIC HEARING

The commissioners discussed the Bluff public hearing held on the Bluff Transfer of Funds for the Bluff Multi-purpose Center. There was unanimous approval for the transfer.

MISS SAN JUAN CONTEST

Sherrri Sweeney, and Arita Sparks met with the commissioners to discuss the Miss San Juan Contest. Pearl Whittaker, fair board chairman, stated that the committee in charge of this contest had already started working on the contest.

CONTROL DISTRICT

There was a question asked concerning the Control District in the zoning ordinance. The question was whether or not those owners of agricultural lands would have to pay commerical rates on their lands within the Control District. The answer was no until the property was used for commerical purposes. The Greenbelt Ordinance still applies to this county.

PLANNING COMMISSION

The commissioners discussed hiring a building inspector for the County and the Cities of Monticello and Blanding. The State Plumbing Inspector was down in San Juan County. He stated that a lot of plumbing and building was being done by people who were not licensed. And these people were not building according to the codes. The commissioners contacted both city managers who agreed with the proposed hiring.

AOG AND EDD BOARD MEETINGS

Commissioner Black reported that he and Mayor Keith Redd had attended the Aog and EDD board meetings. New officers were elected as follows : Walter Axelguard, Pres., Harey Merrill, Vice Pres. and Keith Redd, as sec. The AOC director, Bill Dinehart, will be leaving to take the position of Director of State Lands. May 24, 1978 the board will select a new director.

Commissioner Black also reported on the Energy Impact Money. The county is eligible to receive state impact money and will soon be eligible to received Federal impact money.

Commissioner Black requested permission to attend the National Steering Commission Meeting which will begin May 21, 1978. This will deal with Public Land issues. Permission was given.

BEER LICENSES APPROVED

Beer Licenses for the following people were approved: Susanne Mayberry, of the M 4 Ranch, and the Fry Canyon Operation.

BEER LICENSES DISAPPROVED

The following Beer License was disapproved: Black Oil Company for their Texaco service station in Mexican Hat. This was disapproved because of a county policy made in 1969 stating that

the county doesn't want to put beer into Service Stations and also on the grounds that the number of outlets in Mexican Hat are adequate for the number of customers.

TRAVEL COUNCIL MEMBER



Minutes were read and approved on a motion by Commissioner Guymon and seconded by Commissioner Black.

MEETINGS

The following meetings will be attended by the Commissioners: The Alcohol and Drug abuse meeting, May 18, 1978, Mental Health Meeting, May 16, 1978, Public hearing in Bluff on the Bluff Multipurpose Center May 23, 1978 at 7:30 in the Bluff Elementary School, the Fair board meeting, May 18, 1978.

Commissioner Black has a Tax study committee meeting and a Power Plant Siting meeting on May 16, 1978 and a Blm advisory meeting designed to get input for Wilderness Planning Procedures.

BLANDING SENIOR CITIZENS CENTER

There were no formal bids for the renovation of the Blanding Library so Commissioner Guymon was given the go ahead on getting informal bids or negotiating for a bid to get the work done.

Commissioner Guymon also stated that the Governor's Conference on Aging was a great success.

AREA DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE PLANNING GRANTS

The AOG prepared a letter in support for their application for funding under the Farmers Home Administration "Area Development Assistance Planning Grants" Program. Commissioner Guymon made the motion to approve the letter and to authorize the chairman to sign the letter. This was seconded by Commissioner Black.

MONTICELLO SENIOR CITIZENS

Commissioner Guymon stated that the Monticello Senior Citizens still want the County to purchase the building which now houses the Activity Center. Commissioner Boyle stated that it wasn't adequate for a Senior Citizens Center and that it would be too crowded for the things that they would like to do. He stated that he had discussed at length the present BLM building bid that the county has in with the BLM for their building when they complete the construction of their new building. Mr. Gene Day, Regional Director, stated that the county has a good chance of acquiring this building. Commissioner Boyle also stated that the City of Monticello has received several complaints on the parking problem in front of the Activity Center and they are considering changing the zoning. The Commissioners felt that this would also preclude the county purchasing this building.

SAN JUAN COUNTY MUSEAUM

Mrs. Nell Dalton, and Mrs. Leona Markosek met with the commissioners to discuss the Museum in the basement of the Monticello Library. Mrs. Dalton stated that the Monticello Senior Citizens had been down measuring the room that houses the museum. The commissioners stated that the Senior Citizens had done this on their own responsibility. Mrs. Dalton asked for some guarantee that the Museum would not be moved in the future. Commissioner Black stated that the present commissioners could not bind a future commission legally. However, he also stated that only
